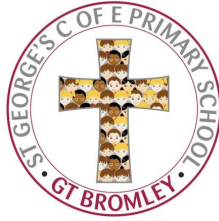

1.0 INTRODUCTION

St George's C of E Primary School welcomes applicants from any interested Parents/Carers.

2.0 ADMISSION INTO EARLY YEARS FOUNDATION STAGE/RECEPTION

All admissions (children aged 4 – 11 years) are dealt with by the School Admissions department of Essex County Council. Parents of reception age children make applications online at https://www.essex.gov.uk/Education-Schools/Schools/Admissions/Pages/Apply_for_a_primary_school_place.aspx

In line with legislation, the school will make arrangements for all children to be admitted in September on a full time basis unless otherwise agreed between the school and the parents.

All children who are due to start at St George's C of E Primary School will have the opportunity to spend some time in the school prior to the actual start date.

3.0 ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

The school's published admission number is 17 children in each academic year.

There is no guarantee of a place for children living in the priority admission area. In the event of oversubscription places will be allocated using the following criteria in the order given:

1. Looked After Children and previously looked after children (as defined in the Primary Education in Essex 2020/2021 booklet);
2. children with a sibling attending the school;
3. children living in the priority admission area;
4. remaining applications.

In the event of oversubscription within any of the above criteria, priority will be determined by straight line distance from home to school, those living closest being given the highest priority.

4.0 APPEALS
